BRIDLEWAY NEWS

We are continuing the process of mapping the routes that are ridden in West Penwith and of course noting where problems have arisen.

We cannot achieve everything overnight but we are building a database of problems both on designated bridleways and on other paths and tracks used by horses.

We hope in due course to have maps available for each area.

If you do have an access problem please report it either to the Secretary, Adrian Bigg or to the local area paths officer for your area. Paths Officers who are already identified are listed at the end of this item.

We have had a meeting with the National Trust at local level to discuss provision of new permissive routes on other land. A thank you is being sent to NT for the work they have carried out so far to clear bridleway overgrown due to the foot and mouth closures.

Trencrom Horse Path overgrown for the last four years – strimmed out by the National Trust. Ongoing discussions to improve signing and extend permissive use and to improve access to Carn.Galver. Watch Croft Bridleway has also been strimmed out fully by the National Trust.

A written report has been submitted for the BHS Divisional Officer to take to the National Trust Estates Office at Cirencenster for the review of the Equine Access Policy document.

We also have other projects and ideas in hand at an early stage to try an improve access.

The bridleway from Mill Downs to Embla Vean was washed out by the winter rains. This has now been reinstated, the surface repaired and new drainage leats provided.

We understand that the modification order to provide a bridleway down from Castle an Dinas past Chysauster has been approved and issued but not yet open to riders until the ground works have been completed – more to follow on this.

With regard to the Upgrade of Footpath from Mulfra over the hill. We understand that a report is being compiled at the moment which will be considered by a panel in September. A decision should be made at that time.

EVENTS DIARY

We had a very successful first group ride on Saturday 30th June. Setting out from The Engine Inn, Nancledra, we rode to Trencrom, (and battled through the then undergrowth!) having picnic lunch in the car park. Then from there almost entirely on bridleway and tracks to Cucurrian Valley, Ludgvan. Up through the valley to Nancledra and back via Embla. About 12 miles over a very leisurely 4 hours including a lunch stop.

The next Leisure Ride has been rescheduled for Saturday August 4th, starting from the Gurnards Head Hotel. 12 noon to ride away. Please park carefully taking up minimum space, skip up droppings etc. Sorry but ride is only open to fully paid up members of WPBA due to insurance reasons. Please phone Paula 01736 794105 if you are intending to come along. The leisure ride will take approx 3-4 hours and will include some roadwork, some open moors and some special concessions on land not normally open to horses. Approximately 12 – 15 miles. Bring a picnic as we will stop half way. (lead rope and headcollar may also be useful)

As a general guide, these rides are minimally organised! You should be able to manage your mount in difficult conditions, busy farmyards, in traffic and in excited company and also be content to ride at a steady pace, enjoying the views and exploring somewhere new. Each individual is responsible to arrange their own personal accident and injury insurance, in addition to insurance for their horse. The group only provides third party liability.

It is most important that where possible you let the organiser know if you are likely to be going on a ride. Knowledge of expected numbers will be very important especially on the first few rides that we do.
